RIVERCITY AWARDS ELECTRONIC TOLLING TAGS CONTRACT

RiverCity Motorway Group has placed an order for the company's first batch of 100,000 electronic tolling tags following the award of a contract to Kapsch TrafficCom AB (Kapsch).

RiverCity Motorway Group Chief Executive Officer Flan Cleary said Kapsch provided the Group with proven and reliable technology, a strong track record and superior value-for-money.

"Kapsch has extensive experience providing 85% of the electronic tags in the Australian market and more than 13 million tags world-wide," he said.

"We expect to issue tags in 2009 through our subsidiary company, FLOW Tolling. The tags will be capable of being used on the CLEM7, as well as all other free-flow toll roads in Australia including Brisbane's Gateway and Logan Motorways.

FLOW Tolling has also been selected to provide electronic tags, marketing and customer service for Brisbane's Hale Street Link which is expected to open in mid 2010.

"FLOW will offer a genuine alternative for Brisbane motorists. Our products will make it easier and faster for motorists to use any of Brisbane's free-flow toll roads," Mr Cleary said.

Regular and occasional users of any of Brisbane's free-flow toll roads will be able to establish a tag or video account with FLOW later this year online, by telephone or at FLOW's customer service centre in Cannon Hill.

In addition to supplying electronic tags, Kapsch is providing the tolling roadside equipment and back-office tolling system for the CLEM7.

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
